
Good news I have received a book for Christmas, I know this to some of you might seem a waste, as it might over exert my already tired brain cell, but for-

tunately there are lots of pictures. To give you a taste of the contents of for said book I will pose you a question to start with.



#### GENEROUS and UNCONDITIONAL LOVE

#### - Not seeking any reward -

Twelve days after Christmas the Church celebrated The Epiphany – the visit of the Wise Men to the infant Christ – a story that offers a refreshing vision of generosity at its best.

We read (Matthew 2.1-12) how the Wise Men followed a star all the way from their homes in the East because they believed it would lead them to an infant king. They were probably astrologers and followers of a pagan religion that believed every important person had a star which rose when they were born and faded when they died. So when the Wise Men saw this star rising in the East they followed it to see who it was that had been born.

We read that the Wise Men went to all this trouble simply so that they could pay their respects to the child once they had found him. We probably all know that when they found Jesus in Bethlehem they respectfully fell to their knees, offering him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh – and then they just went home! The whole story gives us a beautiful illustration of how great effort, care and dignity were poured out simply for their own sakes without demanding or looking for any spin-offs or hidden rewards.

However, it was not a completely functional occasion – we read that when they found Jesus they were overwhelmed with *joy*; even in a dingy stable, even without the usual royal signs of crown and throne the Wise Men knew, without any doubt, that this child was indeed the king of the Jews, the Emmanuel. Perhaps their joy, overwhelming as it was, was because they recognised the presence of God in the child before them. They had the grace to see God in an unexpected place and situation and to respond to him by giving choicest gifts, not counting the cost and not looking for anything more in return than the joy they had already received.

Our world today is one in which we so often hear the question asked: 'What's in it for me?' – a world in which action often appears to expect reward! When we put ourselves in the shoes of the Wise Men we are reminded that we too are faced with a God who loves us just for the sake of loving us; who loves and cares for us equally whether we are good or

bad, kind or cruel, loving or destructive – when we realise we are faced with a God like this, (an image that's actually quite hard to accept), no wonder we find it hard to believe that there really is no catch, no spin-off, no bribe. We do not have to 'perform' in order to earn the love of God. God loves you and me and everyone with such an outpouring love that it fills up and runs over all the boundaries and the limitations we may place on it. In return .. he yearns for us to love him!

The challenge for us is to wonder how we will respond to such a loving God. We should take inspiration from the action of the Wise Men and offer to this God our choicest gifts: the gold of our lives, the frankincense of our open hearts and the myrrh of glad and cheerful neighbourliness — our service of others. There is no catch, no 'small print', no 'hidden agenda', no amassing of 'brownie points' in order to be loved and rewarded by God; only the need to do as those Wise Men did and to go on seeking Jesus until we find him. Like them, we will find Jesus in unexpected places, in ordinary and in unusual encounters. Wherever we find him — and find him we will — all we need to do is to joyfully and gladly understand the generous and unconditional love he already has for us and go on our way rejoicing, loving him as best as we can!

None of us can know what 2018 holds in store, but at this time of New Year resolutions and new beginnings I pray that we may choose to make it a year of pilgrimage, a year in which we are constantly seeking Jesus in order that we may become more aware of his generous love for us. Look out for "Pilgrimage Themes" in the worship of our local churches in the coming months – especially during Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

In this light I wish you all a happy and prosperous 2018 and look forward to journeying in faith alongside you.





## Lewdown Past The Bidlakes of Bridestowe

## an illustrated talk by Elly Babbedge Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February at 7.30 pm Stowford Parish Hall

Great Bidlake is remarkable for having been owned by the Bidlake family for almost all of the last 750 years. Elly Babbedge, also author of a book on Cheriton Fitzpaine's past, has also documented the events of this long history: changes is the estate and its fortunes, events in the civil war, an attempted fraud, women controversially taking the lead in World War One and a school in residence during the Second World War.

December meeting: Martin McDonagh related how Charles Hall, who lived in Lewtrenchard Parish just over 200 years ago, not only influenced Karl Marx but also led an interesting and eventful life. Hall's great work on socialism was probably written at Down House and is considered to have been a significant influence on Marx. Charles Hall, born in 1738 to a presumably Protestant family, was sent to the Douai Catholic college in France, at the advanced age of 19, for reasons unknown, to join a class much younger than himself. He then pursued a medical career in Edinburgh and Leiden (both prestigious places to study medicine then). Despite marrying into a family of substance, throughout his life (as with our better-known local hero, Sabine Baring-Gould) he was somehow always short of money. This was not helped by his free treatment of the poor and having many children. There were also echoes of Todd Gray's recent talk about Sydenham House regarding the stark contrast between the living conditions of the landed gentry and the far more numerous poor. To help support his family, Charles Hall rented and farmed Down Farm, Lew Mill, Wooda, Galford 'Edgecumbe' (Beechcombe?) farms. Later moving to Tavistock, his fortunes deteriorated and he spent some of his later years in a London debtors' prison but, even so, survived to the great age of 89. I was particularly impressed by how Martin McDonagh managed to trace Hall's footsteps around Britain and Europe, 200 years on – and at his many illustrations. A convivial evening was also aided by our excellent buffet: take note, Lewdown Past's AGMs have become something not to be missed!
