

Lewdown Grouped Parish Council Coryton, Lewtrenchard, Marystow and Thrushelton

Meeting of 21st May 2018

Annual Parish Meeting:

Officers were appointed for Marystow and Coryton, chair for Marystow is Cllr Harrop and for Coryton Cllr Newman.

A written report on the past years achievements by 'Soupa Troopers' was provided by Mrs Ruth Dawe. Started in October 2016, a loyal following has now formed with 20-30 participants with as many as 40 people when coincided with the Thrushelton Wool Project. Meeting on the 2nd Wednesday of the month at the Victory Hall. A choice of homemade soups with bread & rolls, tea & biscuits for £3. Organisers are indebted to the V.H. committee for allowing the use of the facilities free of charge. To date £600 has been given back to the VHC, that has enabled them to buy plates etc for future events. To date £374 has been raised to assist the Air Ambulance Landing Light funds.

Annual Grouped Meeting:

Officers were appointed for chair and vice chair. The position of chairman came to Cllr Dunn and vice-chair to Cllr Harrop. The chair provided a report on the previous year's actions. A new grass cutting contract for the verges and sight-line along the West Devon Drive had its first successful year with the new contractor. The Neighbourhood Plan was further consulted. Highway concerns for the safety of the children attending Lewtrenchard Primary School during the start and end of the school days continued. Meetings with Cllr Ball (County Councillor), Cllr Mott (Ward and WDBC) and a representative from Devon and Cornwall Police at the school took place. A proposal from highways had been received, however the PC will aim to provide vehicle operated speed warning signs that will reduce traffic to 20 mph with improved road markings. Funding for improvements will need to be found, including possible grant sources. A safe area for children recreation at the 'Ramps' is still 'work in progress,' Cllr Perkins is co-ordinating any progress with parents and councillors. Problems with Japanese Knotweed had been reported. No statutory bodies take responsibility for the problem, if it is on your land it is your responsibility for the removal. DCC should be notified of any growth on highways. Pot-holes – this continues to be a major problem on our local roads, please continue to make us aware of any problems so the pc can make Highways aware of the dangers. Keep you Parish Council advised of any problems or if you have a good idea that may improve our community. We are really here to help.

Ordinary Meeting:

A report from Cllr Mott (WDBC) included the introduction of the new 'Permission in Principle' scheme come into effect from 1st June and the new General Data Protection Regulations come into force on 25th May. Air Ambulance Landing Site. Planning permission has now been granted. To the councils knowledge fund raising has started exceptionally well, Young Farmers have raised £800, Soupa Troopers £374, Thrushelton PCC £220. The W.I. have also made arrangements to fund raise. The last estimate for the installation that the council needed to fund was £2769.80. Cllr Wilkinson will co-ordinate a link with fund-raisers and the council.

Highways. Council progress had been made with DCC & the Highways Agency with regard to speeding traffic near Lewtrenchard Primary School. There was a plan subject to approval for double yellow lines at the junction of the main road (C822) and the C463. A school clearway on the C463 and a bus clearway on the C822. The County Council was also willing to support the parish funding of solar powered school wig-wag signs, the cost of which is expected in the region of ± 3.5 k.

Lewdown Past The Lewdown and area local history group

Next meeting: Visit to Ambrosia, Lifton on 17th July

Unfortunately we had to submit names of participants about a month ago so could not advertise the visit outside of our members. If anyone is really keen to go, please phone 01566 783396/783567 as soon as possible and we will see if we can still include you.

Our May meeting, **Dunterton: a Plague village?** was an entertaining account of the history of Dunterton church and the demise of the village, like so many others in the 14th century, through plague, thought to have been brought in bolts of cloth. Amazingly the outlines of long gone buildings can still be distinguished on aerial photography, hand-made buttons from the time have been found and certain ghostly echoes of children running and playing in some properties have been reported. On 14th August we will be making a follow-up visit to Dunterton, to which all are invited.

Lewdown: the name

Tim Nash raised an interesting question last month: when had Lewdown first become known as Lewdown? He had spotted that a map of our area from the early 1800s had no mention of Lewdown although 'The New Inn' was shown at the village centre. The first (1809) Ordnance Survey 1" to a mile map does only name the New Inn. Maybe this is because early maps, at a fairly large scale, tended to be somewhat selective, but it has set Lewdown Past a bit of a challenge to find out more.

'Lew Down' is named on a rare 1827 'Map of the County of Devon' by Christopher Greenwood. Going much further back, certain web sites state that Lewdown was one of the earliest Saxon settlements in Devon - but what the Saxons called it, and the source this information is based on, needs following up. June is not a good time of year for sitting in libraries, on at the computer, but I will be asking our members to help with finding a better answer in due course. Hilary Whitelock






Car Run from the Forgotten Garden on Saturday 12th August. Meet at 10.30am. To be followed by barbecue open to everyone from 12.30pm




