Lewtrenchard WI,

July 2018.

The meeting began with a warm and sunny rendition of Jerusalem with all the windows and doors open trying to catch a breathe of air on an unusually hot Dartmoor summer's evening.

We paid tribute to the Reverend Tim Deacon who has sadly passed away, and acknowledged his contribution to our life here and how he will be missed.

After the minutes we were given a report on the NFWI AGM held at Cardiff from our fellow Lifton WI member Heather Major who was our voting representative. It was an amusing and informative report, leaving us with a clear picture of the day and its events.

Our guest speaker was Philip Rhodda of Rhodda's Creamery. He coped well with the lack of electricity and kept us interested and engaged for an hour with tales of Rhodda's through the years from its beginnings with his great grandfather in the 1800's.

They began as a farming family in the Cornish village of Scorrier with a few cows selling their cream at local markets. Philip's Grandmother treated guests to their cream which they loved so much they wanted to take home, to solve this she put the cream in sealed bottles which were put in hot water, this both clotted and sterilized the cream. The process used now is somewhat different as that did not produce the distinctive crust.

Being able to preserve the cream meant it could travel well and trade began with stores and dairy companies up country, with a great deal of business being done in London by the early decades of the C20th.

With the coming of the 2nd World War and rationing they were no longer permitted to make cream and so, to survive they diversified into turkeys and mixed farming. Philip throughout this talk emphasized the need to change and adapt to survive.

The farm land at Scorrier had originally been the site of a coal yard for the shipping of products from nearby tin and copper mines with the coal for transport coming from Wales by boat then horse and cart on a tramway line.

A few years after the end of the 2nd WW, in 1953, an order appeared from an old customer in London who enclosed a cheque which gave them enough working capital to start the cream business once again.

They have also used the skim milk byproduct which was dried at a series of local factories around Cornwall and Devon until recently when the last one closed down and the nearest is up in Westbury in Somerset. Deemed too much

of a distance the milk is used in the making of Ambrosia custard and rice pudding.

Philip also mentioned the EU and the benefits of being awarded Protected Designation of Origin for their clotted cream.

We were shown a range of products including cream, custard, crème fraiche and biscuits and shortbread. We were invited to take any from this selection with a contribution to local charities if we wished to.

There was a good Q&A session showing the engagement of the members in Philip's presentation. Barbara Scott gave the Vote of Thanks.

WI Cream Tea is on Tuesday, 14th August, 3.00pm at the Victory Hall, Lewdown, admission £4.50 in support of the Devon Air Ambulance and the Lewdown Landing Lights.

Next meeting is Monday, September 10th, 7.30pm, Victory Hall, Lewdown. Guest speaker is David Bouch who will talk on Cotehele-The Making of a Christmas Garland.



Lewdown Past The Lewdown and area local history group


Visit to Dunterton church and site of the abandoned village *Tuesday 14th August*



Summary of the main items discussed at the Ordinary meeting on Tuesday 3rd July 2018

<u>Planning</u> - Application reference 1480/18/HHO, 3 Portgate Cottages, Portgate, Lewdown Council decision - Support

<u>Finance</u> –

The RFO provided a copy of the report dated 3rd July. The reconciled bank balance showed a credit balance of £5604.89. Lloyds Bank additional signatories and correspondence address. -The mandate required two signatures for any changes that needed to be made. Former Cllr Baynes offered his assistance to enable the process to be completed with-out further complications. The council formally wishes to thank Mr Baynes for his help. New signatories for the Lloyds Bank account to include Cllr Bones and Cllr Hennessey, the new correspondence address that of the clerk is also being processed by Lloyds Bank. The council is unable

to sign any cheques until all the amendments have been made. <u>Reports from councillors</u> – Cllr Roberts observed that illegal advertising posters had been placed on roadside verges, the council does not condone such actions and would remove them when placed. <u>Report from Cllr Edmonds WDBC</u> – WDBC were offering a 'Summer Sale' for its green waste collections. Bi-weekly collections from July – end September cost just £15.00 (usual annual cost of £40.00). WDBC – annual report came **under** budget. Greater use by the public of the website has had a result of a significant drop in telephone enquiries. <u>New General Data Protection Regulations.</u>

Website compliance – The parish website has been updated by its website provider Vision ICT and is now compliant with the new regulations.

It was resolved that the council becomes members of the Information Commissioners Office

(I.C.O). Registration has taken place. Annual subscription is £40.00 (£35.00 if paid by DD).

Councillors were provided with copies of the draft council Policy and Statement. It was resolved to accept both documents, proposed Cllr Bones, seconded Cllr Dunn.

Cllr Bones requested a dedicated email address. Cllr Dunn has a dedicated email address.

<u>New Councillors</u> – Council discussed recruitment of councillors. Two parishioners expressed an interest and received information.

Notification of a vacancy has been placed on the website and noticeboards.

<u>New Notice-boards</u> - The council wished to thank Andy Nash for erecting and installing the new notice-boards, again his help within the parish is greatly appreciated.

<u>Highways</u> – Notice of road works from Long Parks to Harris Arms 9^{th} - 13^{th} August.

<u>Newslink</u> - It was resolved that the clerk would provide a summary of the council meetings.

<u>New replacement to the Tapp fund</u> – Cllr Edmonds provided a summary of the new fund called the 'Communities Together Fund'. This is open not only to Town and Parish councils but also to local community groups and organisations. A different process to the TAPP fund for approval of a scheme does apply. 




