Devon recycles

Lewtrenchard WI,

March, 11th 2019.

The business of the WI was discussed after we opened by singing Jerusalem. The jumble sale on Saturday 16th March was finally planned as were the preparations for the Tamar Group Meeting on Monday, April 8th where the speaker is to be Ann Widdecombe.

The speaker for this evening was Julie Turner who gave us a talk on The Life and Loves of a Store Detective.

Julie began her work as a store detective at the age of 15 until her marriage some years later.

She began in the Co-op in the Devon YTS scheme in Plymouth, Devonport. Julie explained that her three major characteristics were laziness, hating people and laziness. She went on to explain that finding the job quite boring and having watched the Co-op Store detective visit the store and seemingly wander around without actually doing anything once a week she quickly decided this was the job for her. That he looked very cool was also a persuading factor.

This witty and satirical introduction to her subject set the tone for the rest of a highly amusing evening. Having, at 18, got a job with Boots as a security officer she learnt the 3 main rules around her job, which were firstly, you have to see the person pick the item up from the shelf, secondly then see them conceal it about their person and finally watch the person leave the store with a clear indication that their intent is not to pay for the goods. If all three of these conditions cannot be proved then the person will not be apprehended legally.

When apprehending the shoplifter the store detective cannot use force whilst taking them back into the store, they can caution them in a citizen's arrest and must write down everything the shoplifter says. They cannot be searched by the store detective as this could be construed as common assault, but can be asked to take out the goods and then have to wait for the police to arrive.

Julie then gave us as her alternative set of rules for successful shoplifting which are, nothing frozen, don't look around too obviously checking for store detectives and never leave a store with a smile on your face.

She related a series of incidents from her career. The first was a tale from the Torquay branch of Boots and involved a young man stealing a sandwich and choosing to conceal it somewhat unfortunately down the front of his tracksuit bottoms and in the subsequent chase through the streets it became clear that this was not a good choice. Best at this point to leave it to the reader's imagination.

Julie provided us with some interesting facts around shoplifting: 30% of staff will shoplift and of that number security staff are the highest offenders; different positions of staff within an organization define the type of shoplifting they perform; it is vital that the intent not to pay is clear; billions of pounds a year are lost to shoplifters; if they get away with it they will steal again.

Finishing here with a tale of her first job, having chased a man who stole aftershave which she subsequently saw him drinking the policeman who came to deal with the Page 6

situation kept ignoring her and saying he would listen to her eventually until it was clear because she was so scruffily dressed he assumed she was the culprit.

The evening was a great success marked with a lot of laughter combined with learning quite a bit about a very serious subject skillfully presented. The Vote of Thanks was led by Mary Edgecumbe.

Calling All Dog Owners!!!

Over the last 9 months there has been a spate of dog attacks on sheep in the Coryton/Syndenham area. These attacks have led to 6 sheep being killed and a further 4 sheep being badly injured. The latest attack happened as recently as 5^{th} March when a young sheep received deep puncture wounds to its' hind leg, a 4" full-thickness laceration to a front leg and further minor injuries to its' other front leg - not to mention the psychological trauma she suffered. The dog was seen on this occasion but has not, as yet, been identified. The sheep remains in a shed back at the farm and we hope she recovers.

Being spring there are now a lot of lambs around who would be killed extremely quickly if caught by a dog. Please would owners keep their dogs within sight at all times when out walking and even when they are let out into their own gardens to ensure that the dog does not take itself off for a walk unattended. These things happen extremely quickly with dire consequences. Help from local dog owners in ensuring the welfare of livestock would be greatly appreciated.




Springtime is here so say "goodbye" to winter doldrums and come down to the Forgotten woodland garden of Lewtrenchard and see our bluebells in flower.



The carbonated drinks enterprise had its origins in Tavistock as a venture between Frederick Armes and Samuel Gunn. However, when their premises burnt down in 1896, Gunn relocated to Okehampton and bought the site behind what was then the Barnstaple Inn. In 1906 he built a water treatment plant here to provide clean water for his soft drinks. Orange and lemonade were put in glass bottles but, as the ginger beer carried on fermenting, stronger earthenware bottles were used. Bottles were subject to a deposit and had to go back to the correct factory, there being so many outlets in Plymouth that a bottle exchange was set up. In the early days cold drinks sales tailed off in winter so Gunn operated a coal trade as well. Samuel Gunn died in 1940 but his sons had also entered the business, and it continued to operate until 1965. The earthenware bottles they used were made in Bristol by Price and stamped with the drinks manufacturer's name and location. The earlier bottles with just 'S P Gunn' on are rarer (and more valuable) than ones stamped with 'Gunn and Sons'.

Our speaker Rod Martin, formerly at Okehampton museum, is also a bottle collector who, along with a like-minded group, investigated the Okehampton site, around the derelict factory, in 2017. They used heavy machinery to break up areas of concrete and found, underneath, hundreds of broken bottles but also a fair number that were complete. Why were they here? It seems that bottle requirements changed, probably in the 1930s so all the old stock were discarded and used as hardcore. Their finds included glass bottles with a marble to seal them, which would have been superseded by better-sealed and easier to fill flip-tops and screw tops. Higher cleaning and sterilising standards were also a factor. The earthenware bottles were particularly problematic, the interior being difficult to inspect and a case for their discontinuation was brought when some cyclists found a snail in one! Rod also brought a collection of bottles to pass round - fortunately none were dropped as values of some could run into double or even triple figures.


