



As we have been hinting over the last few months, we are keen to arrange some social events so make of note of the following on your calendars: -

9th October 10am – we are having a coffee morning in the Church to catch up with friends and neighbours. It is also an opportunity to share the new bell tower book shop, jigsaw library and card display that are now open to everyone. Please pop in as we would love to see you.

17th October 9.30 am is our Harvest Festival with the collection for Shekinah Mission in Plymouth. If you would like to join in with flowers to decorate the Church, please do bring to the Church on Saturday 16th or on the morning of the service.

20th November 10am – Christmas Coffee Morning in the Church with craft and gift stalls, the launch of our Christmas Hamper Draw and Christmas Dickens Zoom (does two years make it a tradition?).

11th December – The Traditional (yes let's say two years is a tradition) Marystowe Christmas Dickens Zoom evening. We are beginning to gather thespians/show-offs/has-beens/never-weres together to practise Oliver Twist. As with last year this is a chance for you to embarrass your family and friends by making an exhibition of yourself to be broadcast across the benefice and wider! We are planning to join with the Lifton Singers to include some of the sing along hits from Oliver the Musical. Do please call Joy (01822 860630) if you would like to take part. All proceeds for the evening will be for Marystowe Church and The Children's Society.

Finally, we did make a polite request in our last report on behalf of the volunteers who look after the Churchyard to take away non-compostable rubbish home with you. Unfortunately, a full bin liner was collected again at the beginning of September. We do try and be patient when loved ones are visiting and tending graves, but the beauty and tranquility does rely on our volunteers and we need to nurture them as well!

Lewtrenchard WI

Lewtrenchard WI met on Monday 13th September when our president, Margaret Dunn opened the proceedings with a short business meeting. She reminded members of the coffee morning and walk on Thursday the17th and then congratulated the team of members who had gained 1st place with their exhibit at the Okehampton Show. Member Marion Lethbridge gave a report on Lewtrenchard Produce Show where member Julie Chick won the WI cup and member Karen Alexander won the scarecrow competition with her interpretation of Baa Baa Black Sheep. She then introduced our speaker, David Ramsden MBE, an award he achieved with his work in nature conservation.

David's talk was entitled, Climate and Ecology Crisis? What's all the fuss about?

First of all, David pointed out that Earth was the only habitable planet, the next nearest being 111 light years away. We therefore have no option other than maintaining our planet in an inhabitable state. He reminded us that everything that has ever lived, plants, animals and humans become fossilised when they die and become fossil fuels, natural gas, crude oil and coal. When we mine and use these fossil fuels we are releasing the carbon held in them as carbon dioxide and thus increasing the greenhouse effect. The carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide released from fossil fuels remain above the atmosphere keeping Earth warmer than it should be. Some of this carbon dioxide is absorbed by the oceans making them more acidic and badly affecting the shell fish population.

The Earth's average temperature has already risen by more than a degree since 1880 and the rise is accelerating. This results in increasing ice loss in the Arctic, crop failures are increasing, droughts are increasing, wild life decline is accelerating, fish stocks are low and declining and air pollution is already killing 8.7million people a year.

David explained how the Jet Stream is driven by temperature differences. It separates the cold Arctic air from the Tropics. The Jet Stream can pull cold air South and warm air North. When the Jet Stream goes North it can make the Arctic area hotter and when it goes South it brings colder air South. When it stagnates it causes extremes in weather, eg the beast from the East.

93% of Earth's extreme heat energy goes into the oceans. Now they are warmer they evaporate more causing powerful storms and extra rainfall leading to more floods. Carbon Dioxide levels in the atmosphere have always gone up and down, causing ice ages, but now CO2 levels have shot right up. Temperatures and sea levels go up and down with the levels of CO2. There is

a time lag between emissions and sea level rises so it is possible to predict these. David showed us maps of the likely way this will affect our coastal towns over the next 29 years. It was very sobering.

There is a mass of scientific research and data that proves we are to blame. We can no longer be in denial. It is disturbing that governments cannot pull together to make a real difference. Donald Trump backed out of the Paris Agreement. Australia and China refuse to give up their coal production. The major oil companies spend 200 million dollars a year on anti climate change propaganda a year.

David then gave us his ideas for solutions for society. Here are some of them.

- Use less fuel, switch to a company that uses 100% renewable sources.
- Stop using fossil fuels.
- Ditch your boiler and get a heat pump.
- Start or join a local community energy group.
- Take your money out of fossil fuel investments.
- Don't travel on jets or cruise ships.
- Use public transport or walk, or cycle.
- Eat a lot less meat.
- Eat locally produced food in season.
- Compost more and grow your own.
- Only buy what you need.
- Don't buy new unless you really have to.
- Rehome, re-use, recycle.
- Don't assume your MP supports measures to tackle climate change.
- Keep talking to people about climate change.

If we all do these things it may give us more time. If not, the Earth may well experience the 6th Mass Extinction event.

Monique Hedger thanked David Ramsden for a very informative talk that certainly gave us a lot to think about.





Funding secured for new play area at Roadford Lake

Work to create a new play area at Roadford Lake near Okehampton will start early next year, thanks to generous funding from the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development, South West Water and South West Lakes and its supporters.



The fantastic new Play and Explore facility will replace Roadford's old and outdated play area, which was built in 2005. It will focus on playing and exploring in the natural environment, using materials including sustainably sourced timber and local stone.

South West Lakes' Environment and Engagement Director, Lisa Tame, said: "The new play facility will provide a great outdoor space for families to play and explore together, enabling them to appreciate the natural environment, engage with it, create memories and inspiring them to care for the environment for future generations."

The inclusive play area will feature a


