

- 2. Projector, screen & equipment for planning app's and for other community use. It was resolved to purchase the projector screen and equipment or a total cost of £974.40 including vat. A grant has been provisionally offered of £812.00. The VAT of £162.40 will be claimed back from HMRC.
- 3. Emergency Plan Review of current status, and consideration for a revised plan.

Discussion took place on the merits and pitfalls of producing a E.P, after considered debate the chair requested a decision to support the E.P. Cllr Metherell Proposed, and Cllr Crocker Seconded.

One abstention, motion was carried. Clerk and Cllr Southcott to transpose draft E.P. to Revised new plan. The new plan will be focused on aspects that are relevant to the parishes needs.

Discussion took place on the commemoration of V.E. day on May 8th. Possible joint celebration with the W.I., Soupa Troopers, and a Church service maybe appropriate.

Lewdown Past The Lewdown and area local history group

Tuesday 21 April Bratton Clovelly Church and Village History

Due to recent advice from the government we are reluctantly postponining this meeting.

February meeting: **The Okehampton Archive** was begun about ten years ago by a small group, including our speaker, Christine Marsh. Its aim was specifically to deal with the town's records, as the Museum of Dartmoor Life there had its work cut out dealing with the moor alone. Christine chose several people whose influence is still strong in Okehampton to illustrate their collections of documents and photographs.

In the late nineteenth century many industries took advantage of the fast-flowing Okement rivers to drive waterwheels for power. One such business was that of Charles Geen, later run by his younger brother Henry, who generated electricity in this way for their cabinet and joinery works. Henry was responsible for many improvements in the town, building a large number of affordable houses for workers and improving places of worship for several different denominations. He also extended his supply of electric power to other businesses, shops and even street lighting in 1888-9, before most parts of Devon had even thought about it. However Henry's most outstanding achievement was the planning and building of Okehampton's Victorian Arcade, still a notable feature of the town today. Due to four years of legal wrangling with the council, over whether it could include dwellings as well as shops, it was finally completed in 1900.

Another major benefactor was Sidney Simmons who, although born in Okehampton, was sent away to school at the age of seven and subsequently spent little time in the town, apart from returning to visit relatives. He seems to have a maintained an affection for his birthplace and, after a lucky break in America, acquiring the rights to a mechanical carpet cleaning process, he bestowed many benefits on the town. In 1911 he bought Okehampton Castle, had it restored and left £1000 for upkeep, insufficient now but leaving a fine legacy for its present owner, English Heritage. He also gave land to set up the Golf and Bowling Clubs. Possibly his greatest contribution was buying the land for Sim-

mons Park, to save it from being built on and designing the park himself, as a recreation ground and site for alms houses. He seems to have used his wealth well and, in his will, left generous bequests for all his employees and 37 charities. His great friend Henry Treloar, Mayor of London, said of him 'He is a man who has the head to make money and the heart to give it away'. Certainly three people who will be long-remembered and a fascinating insight into the town's records of their lives.




