


Will close now as there are broad beans to pick, and a greenhouse to water.

citizens advice

Torridge, North, Mid & West Devon

Now here's a topical subject as we try to escape the restrictions imposed by the pandemic and catch up with family and friends abroad or just seek rest and relaxation in the sun.

"I'm due to fly to Spain during the school summer holidays. After hearing about all the problems at airports, I'm really worried. My family have been looking forward to this and it's cost us a lot of money. What do we do if our flight is cancelled or delayed?"

Here's our advice.

If you're already at the airport when the delay is announced, the airline should give you food and drink, access to phone calls and emails. You should also get accommodation if you're delayed overnight including journeys to and from the airport.

Your airline might offer you vouchers to pay for these or advise you to keep receipts to claim back expenses later. They will only refund 'reasonable' expenses, not expensive meals or luxury hotels.

What counts as a long enough delay to get this help depends on how long your flight is. A short flight only needs to be delayed two hours, whereas a flight of more the 3,500km needs to be more than four hours.

It's worth knowing that if your flight is delayed for more than five hours, you don't have to take it. The airline legally has to give you a full refund for that flight (and any onward flights and return flights if you're part-way through a connecting journey.) Talk to someone from the airline as soon as you decide you don't want to fly.

If your flight is cancelled altogether, you've a legal right to either a full refund or a replacement flight to get you to your destination. The refund includes any onward flights and money for a return flight if you are part-way through a connecting journey. Ask about this at the airport if you can.

Don't just rebook another flight yourself – check with the airline first because it's their responsibility to sort out your replacement. If you do have to rebook it yourself, keep any receipts and evidence of why the airline couldn't do this for you e.g. a screen shot of live chats. If the cancellation ends up delaying you getting to your holiday by two or more hours, you're entitled to help with costs.

Check if you're entitled to compensation for a delayed or cancelled flight. Again, this will depend on how long the delay was, the distance, and whether it's the airline's fault. The Citizens Advice website has details on claiming Page 14 compensation for delays or cancellations from the airline. You might also be able to claim from your travel insurance – check if your policy covers this.



- Members of the public open forum one member present. Business as usual, Jerusalem sung, minutes read & signed, 3 Birthdays & a couple of lovely thank you cards. Bags2School raised £60, we are planning to bring back our jumble sale. Cream Tea is definitely back! Tuesday August 9, doors open at 3pm, £5 per person. The Lewdown produce show schedules are out with a new WI entry: The Monica Horn Trophy. Finances & Rampsonwillis Nature Trail were discussed at some length, to be revisited in September.



Then it was time to hand over to our speakers: Karen & Michael Watkins with their eagerly awaited Silk Painting Demonstration.

Michael welcomed us all to his silk scarves demo, he used latex paint to outline a pattern on medium silk which had been stretched and pinned onto a wooden frame. They used to hem the silk themselves but as most of us know this is a very labour intensive job and they now buy the silk already hemmed. Outlining took him but a few minutes. Whilst the paint was drying on the first scarf, Michael started a second one, he used special silk paint, very diluted and quite a large brush to paint large star shaped patterns, paint dries very quickly and you have to work fast, damp & wet conditions are ideal. Whilst painting, Michael chatted about his career, he studied textile design, used to paint in pen, ink & watercolour but always loved painting on silk. Eventually and after several years he decided to concentrate on silk painting. Silk paints can be quite costly, but if you shop around you can find reasonably priced products, he suggested we should have a go. He and Karen have been doing this for over 25 years and are regulars at the Royal Page 32

Cornwall Show, where they count MP Derek Thomas as a fan of their ties. Michael paints scarves, ties & bow ties, but is not keen on the bow ties as they are quite fiddly. The most popular tie design is depicting the planets. Other popular designs are seahorses & dolphins.

Karen is not only the glamourous assistant, she contributes to Michaels art works too, she sprinkles salt onto the wet paint which results in some fabulous patterns, once a scarf is finished, she irons it (that seals in the paint), then hand washes it, dries it and irons it again. They freely admit that working together is rather nice but not without its challenges, but it is all very good natured. Karen then demonstrated 3 ways to wear a scarf properly. Two volunteers helped finish off the first scarf. Members asked how many scarves could they make in a day, this all depends on the intricacy of the pattern, time of day & humidity, but 8 is not an unreasonable amount. They no longer do commissions, they prefer to work on their own designs. Michael and Karen very kindly donated one of the scarves to our raffle in August. Monique gave the VOT which was followed by huge applause for a wonderful demonstration.
