November 12th 2018.

This was our first winter early start meeting at 7pm.

Our guest speaker was Paul Rendell who had come to tell us about The Military on the Moor.

There has been a military presence for at least 1000 years with Iron Age hill forts and a warlike people inhabiting Dartmoor, and of course there is Okehampton Castle which is mentioned in the Doomsday Book.

The 1800's see the first real organised, military presence during the wars with France and America. Prisoners of war had been held in ships at Plymouth but the conditions were becoming impossible so they were marched to Princetown where they built the prison which still stands. There were around 5000 prisoners with officers being permitted 'parole' to live in the local towns around the Moor. At the end of the wars the prisoners were released.

In the 1870's there was a boost in the military presence with a camp of 10,000 troops established for training purposes to see if Dartmoor would be a suitable place for the troops to train. By the time they left at the end of August after some bad weather they said they would never return. The foundations they created for their bell tents can still be seen occasionally around the Moor. Journalists were invited and there are photos from The Times.

In the 1880's however, it was decided to return as its distance from the public made it attractive and the camp at Okehampton was built. The original buildings still exist and the camp is recognisable today from its initial format. Throughout the early C20th the Moor and the camp were used for training. Photographers were invited to take photos of each party and they were reproduced as postcards which was cheap and the troops bought these and sent them to friends and families. Due to this there is a good photographic record available.

There was little awareness of the safety of civilians so the photographers and walkers and general public had access whilst the training was going on. Even when there was live firing and shelling.

The 1ST WW saw 40,000 Dartmoor ponies being rounded up and sent to battle. Only 4000 came back.

Dartmoor was used for training throughout the 1930's and 1940's in the lead up to the 2ndWW. The RAF built decoy airbases to fool the enemy and draw their fire from Plymouth, Harrabear and Yelverton airbases. The road system round Yelverton we use now was built during the war to avoid the airbase in case of the danger of a Plymouth invasion.

Training not only involved shells and guns, around the moor chemicals and

mustard gas still lie buried and secret.

After the war the Moor was given back to the public and local people with Okehampton Camp being retained and some training continuing. The lack the lack of public safety awareness continued, with walkers and users of the moors able to come close to live firing. This changed after a fatal incident in 1962 involving a father and his son who were walkers.

The changes brought about then still exist today with flags, lights and lanterns and notices giving advanced warning. If people are seen then the exercise has to stop and the people are removed. There have been quite a few accidents and deaths due to firing including not just the public but also military personnel.

Nowadays the 10 Tors is a huge PR exercise for the military on Dartmoor. In May they organize 35,45 or 55 mile routes across the Moor for young peoples' groups to take part.

Paul told us of his involvement in this with the Jubilee Trust and Fresh Tracks which is an organization that takes young people, trains them and then they walk a pony across the Moor for 15 miles, an activity which has huge benefits for their mental health.

The military presence has left its mark across the Moor with observation posts of concrete and stone, buried detritus, and the abandoned hardware from decades of training. Their activities have never been documented so much of what has happened is top secret. Training and the public is not an easy partnership but it is the history of Dartmoor and has contributed to making the Moor as we see it today.

Paul's final words were a prediction that whilst the training will continue it will be robots in future as warfare changes.



Dear Neighbour

St. John the Baptist, Stowford needs your help. Currently we have a congregation numbering six parishioners (people living within the parish) and an operating cost of more than £700/month. Financially we can survive for about six months and then we will have no choice but to close the church.

You may know that our incumbent, the Reverend Tim Deacon, sadly died earlier in the year. Presently we have no vicar and the process of finding a new incumbent could well take many months. This does not help the situation.

St. John is at the heart of Stowford, we are lucky to have such a beautiful building in our community. We undertake a number of well attended parish events every year and these will have to cease. This includes Christingles, Stowford Church Lunch, The Great Stowford Duck Race, Harvest Festival, Open Gardens and a first this year the Hayne Manor Event. We are sure you will also miss the church clock, the ringing of our ancient bells and the playing of our wonderfully restored organ.

If, like us, you wish to see St. John open in the future then we need your help. We really need parish residents to join us for services and for those not interested in religious matters but who wish to see the church continue in its work become Friends of St. John and gift a regular sum of money to the parochial church council - no matter how small.

We do not wish for this to look like a begging letter and we are hoping you will understand our need to communicate the predicament our parish is in.


