



Report from November 8th Meeting

The meeting opened with the singing of 'Jerusalem'. Margaret, our president, welcomed everyone and cards were handed out to our members with November birthdays. Margaret reminded us of upcoming events including the Bag2School collection scheduled December 8th, where members and local residents are invited to drop off donations of suitable clothing and household items by 9.00am at Victory Hall or Stowford Hall. A list of acceptable items is available in the Newsletter. The November Walk will be the down the Okehampton tramlines on the 11th and a coffee morning and short walk at Roadford will be on the 18th. Members need to sign up for the Christmas Lunch at Trethorne on January 16th by December and bring the correct money in an envelope to Monique by the January meeting.

We had an update about the Rampsonwillis Nature Trail. Much has been accomplished this year, including the clearing of a large patch of lonicera. Thanks are due to all those who have helped, including some members' families, who have made short work of removing a particularly large and stubborn rhododendron root, and to a neighbour for chain sawing the branches of the same tree. A concealed land drain has been exposed by recent rain, and the Council Tree Officer has undertaken to make it safe and put a fence across the edge, where the stream leaves the site, to protect children.

Margaret then handed over to one of our members, Karen, who with help from her husband had prepared kits to construct bird boxes suitable for different species. Working alone or in pairs a lot of fun was had putting together the floor, sides, roofs, back and front of the boxes. All had been cut to the right size already, and pilot holes drilled for the screws - all we had to do was attach the right bits together. Some hilarity, some cries of frustration as the pieces did not seem to want to come together, occasional bursts of the power-drivers as we grappled with unfamiliar tools and a lot of help from Karen resulted in 12 bird boxes of various sizes, 13 with Karen's prototype, and 1 bat roost. These will all be put up amongst the trees at the Rampsonwillis Nature Trail.

Margaret rounded off the evening by thanking Karen for all her hard work putting the kits together in such a short time and taking photos of the finished products.

We enjoyed tea and the raffle was held, which raised £13 and a plant sale raised £3. Winners of the competitions, which was an interesting item beginning with R, were 1st Heather, with her Ring belt, 2nd Margaret P, with an RAF mug and 3rd Lyn, with a picture of our Ruler. The Flower of the Month was won by Margaret D. The meeting closed at 9.15pm. Our next meeting will be the Christmas party on 13th December.

Minutes of Extraordinary meeting held on Monday 25th October 2021 at Lewdown Victory Hall No 744

- 1. New Councillor: Mr Andrew McSmythurs was co-opted for Marystow Parish, motion proposed by Cllr Wilkinson, seconded Cllr Andrews. Unanimous decision
- 2. Declarations of interest: Cllr Yeo declared an interest for planning applications 3685/21/FUL and 3686/21/LBC and did not vote for both applications.
- 3. Minutes of previous meeting 743 being a true reflection of that meeting was approved and signed. Proposed by Cllr Yeo, seconded Cllr Dawe.
- Planning Ref 2047/21/HHO Readvertisement (revised plans received) Householder application for proposed conversion and extension of small stone shippon, building to form small annex, Broom Park, Coryton, EX20 4PA

Council decision – Support- proposed Cllr Andrews, seconded Cllr Metherell, unanimous.

Planning - Ref 3677/21/HHO Householder app. for rear ground floor extension, Redcliff Cottage, Lewdown, EX20 4DS

Council decision – Support – Proposed Cllr Vanstone, seconded Cllr Metherell, unanimous.

Planning – Ref 3685/21/FUL Proposed conversion of barn to permanent residential, (resubmission of 2757/21/FUL)

Orchard Barton, Lewdown, EX20 4QJ.

Council decision – Support – Proposed Cllr Dawe, seconded Cllr Wilkinson, unanimous

Planning – Ref 3686/21/LBC Listed building consent for proposed conversion of barn to permanent residential (resubmission of 2758/21/LBC), Orchard Barton, Lewdown, EX20 4QJ

Council decision – Support – Proposed Cllr Andrews, seconded Cllr Vanstone, unanimous

5. 'Crossroads' Lewtrenchard, development site visit – Seven council members attended the meeting together with representatives from the developers. Issues regarding surplus water flowing from the site into neighbouring properties were raised with the developers. On inspection a site drain pipe appeared ineffective whilst the recent wet weather should

have provided evidence that the pipe was working effectively. Representatives for the developers suggested that the site was so far incomplete and that the drainage system will be effective on completion of the development, however councillors concluded that the design should be permanent from its concept, the representatives for the developer agreed to resolve the flooding issue. The chair thanked the councillors who attended. Whilst no response has yet been forthcoming from the developers representatives, the council will provide a summary of the meeting to WDBC and ask interested parties to also respond directly to the planning officer for the development.

- 6. Emergency plan A draft plan has been drawn up by the committee members, it was resolved that a simulated emergency is to be instigated to test and see how robust the plan is.
- 7. 25yr Commemorative V.E Day- plaque cost and inscription, It was resolved to purchase a granite stone with an inscription. Quote to be obtained by the clerk. Proposed by Cllr Wilkinson, seconded Cllr Andrews, unanimous.
- 8. 75yr Commemoration of V.E. Day It was resolved not to plant a tree however a new bench is to be purchased with a plaque, to be located at the Ramson Willis recreation ground. Clerk to obtain quotes. Cllr Mott kindly suggested that a Members Locality Community grant maybe available for this project.

- Finance- Payments were approved for Peter van Delft clerk salary £176.80, HMRC – PAYE for clerk £44.20, P. van Delft – Remembrance tree + stake £53.53, Tim Nash – Remembrance wreath £15.00, Visionict – Annual website hosting £150.00, A1 Electrical – New heating & lighting for the hall £2059.06 Proposed by Cllr Dunn, seconded by Cllr Leroy St Louis R.F.O. Reported that after payments and expected receipts a balance of £1922.50. Proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Dunn Draft budget & precept 2022-23 - It was resolved to approve the budget. It was also resolved to approve a 3% increase in the precept for 2022 – 23. Proposed Cllr Dunn, seconded Lorna St Louis
- Cllr Edmonds of WDBC reported that highways may, subject to funding, undertake work of clearing along the kerb stones on the C822 from Sprytown to Lewdown, this would help improve the removal and free flow of surplus rainwater on the highway.
- 4. Refurbishment and repairs to the parish hall The clerk reported that the new kitchen units, and the outdoor furniture has been delivered and the new door had been ordered.
- 5. 75year Remembrance Tree Cllr Edmonds planted the Oak tree in grounds outside St John's Church, Stowford, present were councillors and members of the parish. The plaque was kindly donated by Cllr Edmonds with the backing board made of oak donated by Cllr Kenyon and the supporting plaque stake made by Cllr Leroy St Louis.

Avian Influenza Prevention Zone (AIPZ)

Heart of the South West Trading Standards Service have advised us that as of 5pm on the 3 November 2021 an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone was declared across Great Britain. This means that all bird keepers in Great Britain (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard are required by law to take a range of bio-security precautions:

Schedule 1 - Minimum biosecurity measures applying to all keepers

- Keep domestic ducks and geese separate from other poultry.
- Ensure the areas where birds are kept are unattractive to wild birds, for example by netting ponds, and by removing wild bird food sources.
- Feed and water their birds in enclosed areas to discourage wild birds.
- Minimise movement into and out of bird enclosures.
- Cleanse and disinfect footwear and keep areas where birds live clean and tidy.
- Reduce any existing contamination by cleansing and disinfecting concrete areas and fencing off wet or boggy areas.
- Keep free ranging birds within fenced areas, and ponds, watercourses and permanent standing water must be fenced off (except in specific circumstances, e.g., zoo birds).

Schedule 2 –Enhanced biosecurity measures for premises with over 500 poultry or other captive birds

Keepers with more than 500 birds will need to restrict access for nonessential people on their sites, workers will need to change clothing and footwear before entering bird enclosures and site vehicles will need to be cleaned and disinfected regularly to limit the risk of the disease spreading.


