Why feed raw meat?

Complete dog foods convenient but also contain many artificial colouring's and preservatives that are not necessarily good for your animals health in the long term and they are not what nature designed the dog to eat. Nature designed the dog as a carnivore to eat raw meat having first caught it and killed it.

By the way **DOGS** cannot cook.

They will also eat many types of vegetation to obtain the other nutrients that they require. Raw vegetables are best feed grated for easy digestion. If you are going to feed biscuits to your dog then use them as a separate meal no closer than 4hrs to feeding the meat as the grain slows down the digestive process and is not so easily processed by the dog's digestion system. What we supply is in raw minced meat some containing minced bone that has simply been frozen to preserve it.

The mince with bone should NEVER be cooked.

Our aim is to provide the most natural and safe food for your canine that will aid your dog's health and well-being. It's the amount of artificial colouring's and preservatives currently used in the complete dry foods that is NOT good for any animal?

We recommend that you vary the type of meat that you feed your dog to ensure that your dog gets sufficient calcium in its diet from the raw bone that is part of some minces.

Below is a sample of what we currently supply frozen the full range



For current prices please phone us or check out our Website. There is a lot of good information to be found on the Internet about feeding Raw Meat to your dog.

To ensure your dog gets a good balanced diet consider giving them oily fish once a week and on a different day a raw egg on there main meal and table scraps can be fed in moderation.

The following table is for guidance only. These figures should be adjusted to suit the dogs' activity and breed characteristics

Animal weight (Kg)			Raw Meat (g)		
1	to	5	10	to	50
6	to	10	60	to	100
11	to	20	110	to	200
21	to	30	210	to	300
31	to	40	310	to	400
41	to	50	410	to	500
51	to	60	510	to	600
61	to	70	610	to	700
71	to	80	710	to	800

This table is based on the amount of raw meat at a rate of 10g /Kg of body weight. These amounts should be adjusted to suit your particular animal by monitoring the animal's weight and condition.

Note If your Dog loses weight then increase the amount of food given. If your Dog gains weight then reduce the amount of food given. Continue to make adjustments until you find the ideal amount of food for your Dog. Please also bear in mind that what passes out of your dog will also change and is usually far less unpleasant to pick up when out for walks.
