

The Pinwell Sisters By Helen Wilson

For many years I have been aware that the beautiful Rood Screen erected at St. Peter's Church in Lewtrenchard was erected there at the order of the Rev. Sabine Baring-Gould in the late 19th and early 20th Centuries. I have also known that they were the work of the Pinwell Sisters of Ermington in South Devon. Apart from that I knew nothing else about these ladies and was simply left wondering how at that time of male domination was such beautiful woodwork commercially provided by women. Now I need wonder now longer.

The answer lies in an incredible amount of research carried out by Helen Wilson and presented in a delightful and beautiful illustrated book by Helen Wilson who some of have met when she spoke to a group of us at St. Peter's Church The Pinwell sisters were responsible for a vast amount of stunning woodcarvings of screens, fonts and pulpits in many churches in Devon, Cornwall and occasionally further afield. Locally, in addition to St. Peters, this included the Church at Lydford. They also worked on the Cathedral in Truro.

The book is available from Helen Wilson For £25 plus £4 p&p. at 3 Thornhill Road, Plymouth, PL3 5NF. The cost reflects the fact the book includes a very large number of magnificent photos many taken by herself but alongside many original photographs taken by the Pinwell Sisters themselves. 





It was hot, that late July day just after the war But there was a breeze that plucked playfully at the hay We had been busy rowing up, Old Blossom and me Ready to be picked up with the loader later that day.

She was hot too and her dappled coat shone in the sun I had put some leafy twigs in her bridle to keep off the flies Since late morning we had worked steadily until lunch Now, even along under the hedge side it lay open and dried.

It is not grown much today but then it often was But Sainfoin, when mixed with grass makes excellent hay The pretty pink flowers give off a most pleasant aroma Which, turning into the breeze each time pleasantly came our way.

The heat had steadily built up and it was now quite hot Generating those miniature whirlwinds that teased the neat rows of hay Then a more powerful one drifted slowly across the field And obviously it was heading our way.

When it hit us it was like a vacuum with a pressure one could feel Old Blossom tossed her head and didn't like it at all Then it was gone, out over the hedge and away And the hay it had lifted floated slowly down to fall.

Three o'clock came and also the wagon and loader Old Blossom had done her work on time The loader, pulled behind, cleverly picked up the hay And dropped it gently on the wagon from behind. Page 20 There a man skilfully built the load until it was full My job now was leading the horse along the waiting rows The weather stayed fine and soon the field was all cleared Yes! I remember Sainfoin Close from that day of long ago.


