

We were very lucky with the weather at all events which was a bonus . For those of you who weren't able to attend you missed a cracking few days .


STOWFORD HALL



Annual Grouped Meeting

 Chairs welcome + annual report – The chair provided a summary of the main items of business the past year including the processing of 30 planning applications, the installation and unveiling of the 25year V.E.
 Commemorative stone at Rampsonwillis, Emergency plan and purchase for much of the equipment, distribution of the E.P. parishioner booklet, repairs to bench and noticeboard, 'speedwatch' monitoring, and working alongside community & residents with arrangements for the Queens Platinum Jubilee.

Appointment of Officers
 Election of Chair – Cllr Andrew elected, proposed by Cllr Dawe, seconded Cllr Perkins all in favour.
 Election of Vice Chair – Cllr Southcott elected, proposed by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr Metherell, all in favour.

Ordinary Meeting

Members of the public open forum – 6 members were present, a
parishioner raised concerns over the Stoney Road parked vehicles
obstructing parts of the highway and stated that difficulties over access
due to parked vehicles for emergency services could arise and that also
some delivery vehicles had experienced similar difficulties when delivering
product to some households.

 clerk, proposed by Cllr McSmythurs, seconded by Cllr Harrop, all in favour.

- 2.1 Payments were authorised for; Dean Elliot Grass cutting £110.00, Caroline Harris Bookkeeping Services – Payroll services £150.00
 W.D.B.C. – Dog Bin emptying service (paid by D/D) £381.89, BHIB – Parish Insurance annual premium £407.86 DALC – Annual subscription £188.80, Mrs R. Dawe - supply of unveiling veil £7.00, P. van Delft – clerk salary (April – May) £297.76 HMRC – PAYE £63.20
 P. van Delft – clerk administration supplies £65.91, Proposed by Cllr Perkins, seconded by Cllr Metherell, all in favour.
- 2.2 R.F.O Reported a combined balance after payments of £22,046.73, proposed by Cllr McSmythurs, seconded by Cllr Yeo, all in favour.
- 3. Reports from councillors; ClIr Dawe reported that the drainage water pipe by Alder quarry to Beech Coombe Farm has been repaired. ClIr Wilkinson reported that a parishioner had contacted him regarding the dumping of waste soil on land at Allerford Farm and that the traffic associated with the movement of the soil has inappropriate for the local highways, ClIr Southcott to look into the complaint. ClIr Southcott reported that the 'Speedwatch' team had recorded over 519 vehicles exceeding the speed limit through the village, some vehicles were recorded SORN or no insurance. More volunteers are welcome to help the team, support for the work has been appreciated by parishioners.
- 4. Reports from WDBC Cllr Mott was re-elected as mayor, many reports are now coming direct from WDBC to the clerk and then circulated to councillors. Waste recycling was still a problem however fewer complaints have been received recently.
- 5. Rampsonwillis plans/planning & fundraising update. Cllr Perkins reported that a fundraising music festival event would be held on September 18th and was seeking support from the council to hold the event, help was needed including stewards for the event, insurance cover needed to be checked. A bucket collection at the Queens jubilee was requested to aid the fundraising. Cllr Harrop suggested that a pre- planning application was sought for the project Cllr Andrews and McSmythurs to help. Cllr Perkins said that she needed more Cllr help with the project, Cllrs Southcott, Wilkinson offered their assistance on the committee.

The Queens Jubilee Celebrations – arrangements. Cllr Harrop reported that many of the events had now been arranged including the beacon lighting & BBQ, prices for food had also been agreed. The Sunday big lunch was also on the whole arranged, with bring and share food, games, televised events in the hall, a bar at the recreation ground, gifts for the parish children will be presented at 3pm.

Queens Jubilee Bench – It was resolved that Cllr Andrews would provide, if suitable, aluminum bench ends, Cllr Wilkinson would look to see if it was

possible to rebuild it with new wood. The preferred inscription 'Queen Elizabeth 11 Platinum Jubilee 1952-2022' with a verse selected from the school competition was agreed, proposed by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr Perkins, all in favour, the school to be contacted.

Jubilee gifts – it was resolved to provide a pen and drinking mug for all parish children under the age 11 still at primary school. It was resolved that the council would underwrite any financial shortfall upto a ceiling of £1000, this is for the provision of supplies and services for the Jubilee celebrations. A 'localities' grant from WDBC Cllrs Mott and Southcott of £500 to hold the events was appreciated, motion proposed by Cllr Southcott, seconded by Cllr Harrop, all in favour.

- 6. Stoney Road layby/passing area- This was raised on item 1, however Cllr Andrews stressed that this issue needed urgent attention. Cllr Southcott to contact Devon Highways and enquire what could be done to alleviate the problem.
- 7. VAS signs in the vicinity of the school funding and positioning. Cllr Southcott informed that there were several signs available but any sign needed the approval from Devon Highways, each sign costs in the region of £2500. Some consultation had taken place with parishioners regarding the location and positioning of the signs. Cllr Southcott suggested that a movable sign located in the 40mph zone. Signs records the speeds but it does not record the registration numbers of vehicles. Cllr Southcott informed that the Devon Highways consultation process for the changes to the proposed safety measures would take place soon. Cllr Perkins reminded council that the problem of the bus services is still dropping off children at and in the Junction opposite the school and that this still posed a serious safety concern for the children crossing the road, it was suggested that a letter should be written to the bus company regarding the safety concerns the council have.
- 8. Emergency plan update A 'Devon Communities Together' grant had been awarded of £1097.73 for the purchase of equipment that maybe needed for emergencies, some items are still needed to be purchased. The clerk reminded council that D.C.T would like to see the final copy of the E.P. asap.
- 9. Repair or replacement noticeboard near the war memorial It was resolved to repair the damaged noticeboard; it was estimated the cost was around £100. A motion to repair was proposed by Cllr Southcott seconded by Cllr Wilkinson. Cllr Harrop agreed to repair the noticeboard. A new replacement noticeboard costing about £650 may be required in 5 years' time.
- 10. New Councillors A parishioner expressed an interest in the position, the clerk to provide appropriate forms for completion.

11. Correspondence – A parishioner expressed concern regarding the possible location for a VAS camera, hedge maintenance and visibility on entry to the highway was also asked to be considered by the council.
