Voter Identification

From May 2023 people will need to produce an accepted form of photographic ID to prove their identity before they will be issued with a ballot paper. This includes people acting as a proxy for other individuals.

This is a national change implemented as part of the Elections Act 2022.

This will apply for the local elections taking place in the South Hams and West Devon on 4 May 2023.

To vote in person voters must be on the electoral register **and** bring a suitable form of photographic ID to their polling station. The most commonly used IDs include:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Photographic driving licence issued by the UK, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (including provisional)
- European Economic Area (EEA) photographic ID Card
- UK Biometric Residence Permit
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (PASS card)
- A Blue Badge
- A concessionary travel pass funded by HM Government or local authority

A full list of the photo ID that will be accepted is available on the Gov.UK site.

No suitable photo ID?

Where an individual does not have one of these accepted forms of photo ID, they can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. This can be obtained, for free, from their local Electoral Registration Officer. The document contains an elector's name and photograph.

You must be on the electoral register to apply.

Apply for a Voter Authority Certificate on the Gov.UK website .

The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for the local elections in England on 4 May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April 2023.

Voters who do not produce a Voter Authority Certificate, or valid photo identification, will not be allowed to vote on the day.

Postal voting

Postal voters will not be affected and will be issued with their postal ballot papers as usual.

Meeting No 714

Minutes of ordinary meeting held on 10th January 2023

These minutes are provisional until they are signed by the chair at the next meeting of the parish council.

1. Broadband – Unfortunately the fibre presentation from Airband did not take place, Fay Cross failed to appear. The chair asked councillors and parishioners what experiences they currently have with their broadband and what they would like to see from Airband. Responses included; when the infrastructure would be installed and ready for use, what level of service would be available, what upload and down load speeds could be expected, what would be the cost of installation per household, what service is available for public buildings such as our village hall. An apology for not attending the event. Cllr Kenyon informed that Airband had a limited offer to buy out of contract agreements with customers who wished to signup to their service.
2. Dispensations & declarations of interest – Cllr Leroy St Louis item 7.
3. Minutes of previous meetings 712 and 713 were signed by the chair as a true and accurate records of those meetings, Minute No 712 proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Kenyon, all in favour. Minute No 713 proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded by Cllr Kenyon, all in favour.
4. Parish Hall lease agreement – The renewed 99 year lease agreement was signed by the Chair and Clerk/RFO, motion proposed by Cllr Kenyon, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis all in favour. The clerk to send back the signed agreement to the solicitor so that it can be registered with Land Registry.
5. Planning – Ref 4244/22/HHO – Householder application for erection of a timber pre-fabricated single-storey granny annex. Site – Greengables, Stowford, Lewdown, EX20 4BY, Council decision – Support, proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis all in favour
6. Finance – Payment were authorised for the following invoices – Clerk salary P van Delft (Nov- Dec)£280.80, HMRC – PAYE £ 34.80, Parnalls Solicitors – Work relating to lease agreement £954.00, Vision ICT – Website provider annual renewal £143.26, Stowford PCC – Ground maintenance grant £200.00, Citizens Advice – donation, £100.00, Newslink – donation £50.00, Lewtrenchard Primary School – donation £ 50.00. Motion proposed by Cllr Cllr Kenyon, seconded by Cllr Govett, all in favour. The R.F.O. Reported a credit balance of £5130.89 after approved payments, motion to propose by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Govett, all in favour. Budget 2023-24 and precept request - It was resolved to increase the precept by 3% to £3105, motion proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Kenyon, all in favour.
7. New councillors – One vacancy still remains; one interested parishioner would like to apply when their time permits.
8. Cllr Edmonds of WDBC. Cllr Govett asked questions regarding the policies that are in

place at WDBC for processing and decision making of planning applications for the parish, included what the planning policy is for single and multiple building applications, and what are the planning policies for land adjacent to a conservation area/boundary. Cllr Edmonds responded that he had sought the advice from colleagues in the planning dept for the questions raised by Cllr Govett. Cllr Edmonds proceeded by providing council members relative excerpts from the 'Joint Local Plan' that covers South Hams, Plymouth and West Devon and the 'Supplementary Planning Document' relating to various policies in particular **Sustainable villages TTV25, DEV8, DEV9 and DEV21. Conservation areas** are covered in policy DEV21 of which the parish of Stowford is partially included. Cllr Edmonds further provided a detailed explanation relating to Cllr Govetts questions on the WDBC planning policy highlighting excerpts of the planning policies in the JLP and SPD that relate to Stowford. Cllr Govett thanked Cllr Edmonds for his detailed explanation and prompt response.

9. Safeguarding of the 1839 Parish Map – quote to scan, print and frame for the sum of £545 was approved. Proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Kenyon, all in favour.
10. Defibrillator training – The chairman reported that the Stowford Parish Hall committee were making arrangements and details of the training event would be made available in due course. A grant for training is available to S.P.H.C. should they so wish to apply.
11. Coronation of King Charles III – 6th May 2023, it was resolved that idea's for the parish celebrations should be forwarded on to the clerk.
12. Recreation Ground – The election of Parish Council board representative. Cllr Law proposed Cllr Leroy St Louis to stand, Cllr Govett seconded the motion all in favour, Cllr Leroy St Louis did not vote. It was resolved that Cllr Leroy St Louis to represent the Parish Council on the Board of Trustees for the Recreation Ground.
13. Cllrs reports: Cllr Leroy St Louis reported that one of the Remembrance statues had been slightly uplifted, it was considered that the best method of securing both statues were to Postcrete the ground supports for both statues. The motion was proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Kenyon, all in favour. Cllr Leroy St Louis to contact the warden to seek permission. Cllr Leroy St Louis informed that the recent Police and Crime Commissioners survey was unable to be accessed via the internet and that the timescale was thought to be inadequate.
14. GDPR your responsibilities – Cllr Leroy St Louis advised councillors to be aware of unsolicited emails, an easy way to check the senders email address, then if thought to be dangerous to delete and bin the sender's correspondence.
15. Mailchimp – administration. Cllr Govett informed that the Parish Council now has an account that it could use for disseminating practical information that may be helpful to parishioners. Information that could be distributed included road closures, social events, local news council updates etc. The clerk to enquire what the cost would be to set up Mailchimp access on its website. It was thought that the chair and Cllr Govett were to select newsworthy items and uploading of the documents. Meeting closed 9.25pm

Then it was time to hand over to our speaker: Nicola, talking about her hobby of keeping amphibians. Nicola started by thanking us for inviting her. Her interest started when she was 12, she decided to start with tropical fish and then moved on to cold-water fish & marine fish. Nicola had to do a lot of research for marine fish as they require a very delicate saline balance & the correct environment. Nicola showed us many photos of amphibians all taken by herself. Britain has 6 species of amphibians and 6 species of reptiles and Nicola showed pictures of all and gave information about them. Nicola has seen 4 of these species in and around her garden/ponds. She then continued to describe other species commonly kept in captivity with their correct environment with plenty of space and interest, some require heat. Light is very important and good & nutritious food. Nicola shared a few funny stories about escaped snakes and how she came to the rescue. Karen also had a funny story about snakes; instead of raining men, she had raining adders in her pub courtyard, the punters did not see the funny side. Several questions came from the floor including; can one have a conversation with Iguanas? The answer is yes you most certainly can. How much time does it take up to look after them? Not all that much. Nicola brought with her a couple of very small fire bellied toads & 2 beautiful tortoises. Her talk was fascinating, interesting, very easy going and humorous, like the leopard gecko: If you look through one ear, you can see straight out the other, it has literally nothing between the ears. Barbara thanked Nicola for a lovely talk, truly inspiring.

Lewdown Past
The Lewdown and area local history group
Coffers, Clysters, Comfrey and Coifs:
the lives of our 17th C ancestors
An illustrated talk by Janet Few
Stowford Parish Hall, 7.30 pm on Tuesday 21st March



Janet Few has visited us before, in the guise of Mistress Agnes, who told us all about her 17th century garden. This time she will be revealing some of the details of ordinary domestic life from that time. For instance, what colour were carrots then? What did the Cavaliers do for deodorant - would you even think they used it?

January meeting: Holy Wells of Devon and Cornwall by Terry Faull.

Many natural springs supplied our ancient ancestors with a vital supply of fresh water. But some sources were also attributed with powers of healing or divination, and revered as part of early religious beliefs. Sensibly, the early Christian leaders did not outlaw the worship of natural features but took them over, often changing the pagan deity's name to that of a saint, springs usually being associated with a female spirit. Holy wells are particularly prolific and well-preserved in our area as Anglo-Saxon influence obliterated many further east.

Some wells have a less salubrious history and a reputedly gloomy atmosphere. At Lidwell, near Dawlish, a 13th century a monk inhabited a chantry chapel there and would offer overnight accommodation to passing travellers. The well was abandoned at the Dissolution; later excavations revealed the piled-up bones of the unfortunate travellers at the bottom.

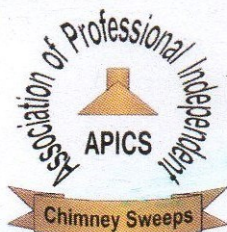

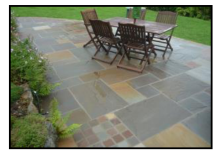

Minute No 757 of Monday 30th January 2023 held at the Victory Hall
These minutes are abbreviated for the full minutes please visit our website www.Lewdowngroupedparishcouncil.org.uk

1. Apologies for absence – Cllrs Dawe, Perkins, Richards & Yeo
2. Dispensations & declarations of interest – Cllr Vanstone item 6.
3. Minutes of previous meeting 756 being a true reflection of that meeting was approved and signed by the chair after one amendment to the draft on item 10 was made. Proposed Cllr Wilkinson, seconded Cllr McSmythurs, all in favour.
4. Planning Ref: 4199/22/FUL New building for reptile and exoskeleton treatment and recovery unit, Site Hillside Farm, Lewdown, Okehampton EX20 4QL. Council decision -Support, proposed by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr McSmythurs, Cllr Vanstone abstained all others were in favour.
5. Finance – 5.1 The following Invoices due for payment were authorised; P. van Delft – clerk salary (Dec-Jan) £347.36, HMRC – PAYE £45.60, Lewdown Cricket Club – Donation £15.00, Newslink – Donation £250.00, Citizens Advice – Donation £250.00, Lewdown Victory Hall – Hall hire (July- Dec)£155.00, Motion proposed by Cllr Metherell, seconded by Cllr Southcott, all in favour. 7.2 R.F.O Reported a combined credit balance of £22,453.82. proposed as an accurate report by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr McSmythurs, all in favour. 7.3 Cllrs approved the revised budget motion proposed by Cllr McSmythurs, seconded by Cllr Harrop, all in favour. The council approved the precept of £8524 for year 2023-24, motion proposed by Cllr McSmythurs, seconded b Cllr Metherell, all in favour.
6. Cllr Mott (WDBC) – Reported that the council was completing its budget forecast, the joint venture with D.C.C. had successfully secured a grant bid that allowed for the building of a second railway station in Okehampton. The ‘Warm Hubs’ grant is available for councils, clubs, and associations to apply for.
7. Reports from councillors – Cllr Wilkinson reported that a retaining wall had partially collapsed, work to repair the damage will commence in due course. Cllr Southcott reported that WDBC had a road sweeper that was available for the parishes use, it was resolved that Cllr Southcott would ask WDBC to arrange for the road sweeping around the village asap and then on an annual routine program. Cllr Richards asked if training was available for the use of the Defibrillator, Cllr Southcott suggested that ‘First Responders’ could be considered a possibility, this could be a community member.
8. Queens Platinum Jubilee bench – It was resolved that the bench is placed to the left of the Oak Remembrance tree, motion proposed by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr Wilkinson, all in favour. The wording for the second plaque was not thought suitable for the bench, it was resolved to hold over the wording to the next meeting.
9. Financial assistance for Lewtrenchard school ‘Rewilding Project’. It was resolved

that more information on the level of financial assistance is required. Cllr Richards to respond.

10. Section 106 money – affordable housing contribution use for the parishes. It was resolved that since the P.C. does not have any new schemes that would benefit from the contribution, it would not seek to pursue this further in this instance.
11. Play area equipment – Committee report – It was resolved to hold this over to the next meeting.
12. King Charles coronation – celebration/planning. It was resolved that since the Victory Hall Committee had started to make arrangements for the celebrations it would wait to hear back from the V.H.C. if it required any assistance from the P.C.
13. Vehicle activated signs – Cllr Southcott reported that he had agreed with Devon Highways 3 locations that poles for the VAS will be positioned on. Total cost for the installation and equipment excluding VAT was £3594.47. Unfortunately, the sponsor that had offered to support the project was not forthcoming at present. It was resolved that a Localities grant to be applied for from D.C.C. motion proposed by Cllr Harrop, seconded by Cllr Southcott, all in favour. Unfortunately, Lottery funding was not available for this project. Cllr McSmythurs suggested that the Parish Council should underwrite the project, the funding to come from the existing council reserves however fundraising and sponsorship must be sought, motion proposed by Cllr McSmythurs, seconded by Cllr Metherell all in favour. Cllr Metherell suggested that Lewtrenchard school and other local groups, associations and clubs to be contacted to help support the funding of the project. Cllr McSmythurs asked if the project could be started as soon as possible.
14. Warm Hubs grant – WDBC grant available for groups, clubs and associations. It was resolved that the parish council apply from both WDBC locality budgets for the grant, money to go towards supporting groups such as Soupa Troopers etc. The clerk to apply.
15. Emergency Plan – Draft plan for consideration, storage of equipment. The latest revision was sent to D.C.R however some more minor revisions were requested, these to be dealt with and resubmitted by Cllr Southcott. Cllr Harrop suggested that this final resubmission is sent for approval asap. Discussion took place for the storage of equipment that is currently with Cllr Southcott without any conclusion.
16. Road warden Scheme - Council/councilor participation. Cllr Southcott informed that ‘Chapter 8’ training would be required for the implementation of minor highway repairs.
17. Planning applications – Training for councillors can be arranged through DALC at a cost or a WDBC senior officer could arrange for a training session after the local elections.
18. Correspondence – Letters of appreciation for donations received from Marystowe, Lewtrenchard, & Thrushelton PCC’s. Parishioner letter of concern over speed limit by Lew Trenchard Primary School.
19. Meeting closed 9.29pm. Date, place and time of next meeting 27th February at Lewdown Victory Hall, 7.30pm
