

These minutes are provisional until they are signed by the chair at the next meeting of the parish council.

Meeting No 723

- 1. Apologies Cllr Alexander
- 2. Dispensations & declarations of interest none.
- 3. Minutes of previous meeting 722 were signed as a true and accurate record of that meeting, proposed by Cllr Lorna St Loius, seconded by Cllr Judy Law, all in favour.
- 4. Finance 6.1 Computer replacement + software It was resolved to purchase a new Laptop from Amazon + Software, cost £319.99, proposed Cllr Govett, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour. 6.2 Payments were approved Peter van Delft clerk salary (Nov-Dec) £435.72, HMRC PAYE for clerk £34.40. Proposed by Cllr Law, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour. 6.3 R.F.O. reported a credit balance as at 9th January of £4,978.70 (excluding the purchase of the replacement computer and software) proposed Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Law, all in favour. 6.4 Draft budget & precept A review of the R.F.O. proposed budget showed a forecast of expenses amounting to £3336, a precept of £3265 would therefore be required. The motion to approve the precept of £3265 was proposed by Cllr Law, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour.
- 5. Bus shelter request The response from Lewdown Grouped Parish Council for the positioning of a bus shelter at the current location of the bus stop opposite the former Royal Exchange was supported by the council however L.G.P.C. could not provide any financial assistance and would note be able to provide any financial support or any other liability of its standing. The chair suggested that a public consultation should now take place to ascertain what level of support and use a bus shelter would have, the consultation would be promoted through the Newslink and the Parish Council website. Cllr Law also suggested that notices should be put up on the noticeboards.
- 6. Councillor vacancies two councillor seats no new interest yet.
- 7. Cllr Edmonds reported that WDBC had purchased 5 properties in the Okehampton area to help with homeless, Ukraine and Afgan families. It is also on target to purchase a further 3 properties to also help reduce homeless, Ukraine and Afgan families in the area. Funding has come from central government schemes and Devon County Council.

Recipe of the Month

Did you know that Watercress is a proper Superfood? With more than 28 essential vitamins, minerals, and compounds, watercress is a high protein content superfood offering a distinctive taste that stands out from many of the muted flavours other salad greens provide. Here is a simple Watercress Soup Recipe:

Ingredients - Serves 4

15ml/1 tbsp olive oil 1 small onion, chopped 1 small stick celery 350g/12oz potato, peeled and diced 600ml/1pt chicken or vegetable stock 3 (85g) bags watercress 150ml/1/4pt milk pinch of nutmeg squeeze of lemon juice salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method

Step 1

Heat the oil in a large pan, add the onion and celery and sauté over a medium heat for 5 mins until pale golden. Stir in the potato and stock and bring to the boil. Cover and simmer for 10 mins or until the potato is tender. Step 2

Stir in the watercress, cover and cook for a further 5 mins or until the watercress is wilted. Transfer the soup to a food processor and blitz until smooth. Return the soup to the rinsed out pan add the milk, nutmeg, lemon juice and seasoning to taste. Gently reheat until piping hot and serve with crusty bread.

No-Dig Gardening by the Soil Association

What is no-dig gardening?

Many of you will have heard of no-dig gardening, a method that has gained popularity in recent years and has a lot to offer for soil health and those that depend on it. It's an organic way of growing plants, and the principle is simple; leave the ground as undisturbed as possible and you'll end up with less pests, healthier plants and a healthy vibrant soil community.

What are the benefits of no-dig gardening?

Rather than digging the soil to remove weeds, the no-dig method promotes adding garden compost or manure to the surface of the soil. This emulates the natural processes in an ecosystem, as leaves fall to the ground, break down and incorporate into the soil.

By doing this, the structure of the soil is also maintained, leaving worms and other soil-dwelling organisms undisturbed and the ecosystem intact.

What's more, it's a great option for gardeners who don't have time to dig over beds and borders - let the soil work its magic!

How - doesn't it take ages?

In fact, the opposite is true. Once setup, a no-dig system can be incredibly time efficient. This is because in the long run you will need to spend much less time digging and weeding. No-dig works on the principle that healthy, covered soils are less weedy because weeds are most present in soil that needs healing.

Top tip: You will need access to plenty of mulch and compost as weeds are kept at bay by being constantly covered.

Getting started

If you'd like to get started with a no-dig veg patch or bed, no-dig expert Charles Dowding suggests starting by covering grass with cardboard then adding a thick layer of compost. Use brown sheets of cardboard with minimal ink and remove metal clips and tape. Plant into the top of your compost and mulch around your plants. Over time the soil will become a haven for worms which will help to loosen the soil and keep it aerated.

The best time of year to convert to a no-dig system (or turn an area of lawn into a veg patch) is in the late autumn after your final harvests.

No-dig and mycorrhizae

You may sometimes see white strands within the soil. These are likely to be mycorrhizal fungi which are safe and beneficial. Most plant roots team up with fungal networks working in partnership – the fungi feed off sugars from the roots whilst the plant uses the expansive fungal network to receive nutrients and water beyond its own catchment. These delicate networks are doomed to die if the soil is turned, particularly as the fungi can't tolerate exposure to the air.







Damp and Mould

"Damp and mould is building up in our house. Our living room is worst and there's a strong smell so we have stopped having friends round. We're also concerned about our health. We've reported it to the landlord who has done nothing. We've six months left on the tenancy agreement and running out of options. What should we do?"

Absolutely right to tell the landlord but to work out if they are responsible you need to find the cause of the damp and mould, but this can take time unless it is clear there is a leaking roof or bad insulation.

Damp occurs when property doesn't dry out. It can be rising, penetrating, construction or condensation damp and can lead to mould, the fungus that grows where warm, damp air condenses on cold surfaces like window frames. The following link will help establish they type of damp, who is responsible and what you can do https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/housing/repairs-in-rented-housing/repairs-common-problems/repairs-damp/

Your landlord is responsible for fixing a damp problem if it's making your home unsafe and unhealthy. They will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have done like rotting window frames. They would have to cover the cost of repairs to any items damaged by the damp including carpets and furniture. Keeping homes well heated and well ventilated is the best way to prevent condensation but with high heating costs and cold weather this isn't always easy. Try to avoid doing anything that makes damp worse like drying clothes on heaters, blocking air vents or using portable gas heaters as that may affect whether the landlord takes responsibility for repairs.


Be Alert for Asian hornets!

Asian or yellow-legged hornets (scientific name *Vespa velutina*) were accidentally introduced into France in around 2004. Now they have spread through much of Western Europe. They are serious predators of honey bees, and also attack bumblebees, solitary bees and other insects.

They defend their nests aggressively and will attack anyone who gets too close: **never approach a nest**. Since 2016, there have been sightings of the Asian hornet in the UK, and a few nests have been found.

Asian hornets are generally smaller (25-30 mm head to tail) than our native hornet, the European hornet (*Vespa crabro*), which is 30-35 mm head to tail (but can seem much bigger!). They are easy to distinguish because Asian hornets are mostly dark brown/black, with yellow 'socks' and an orange-yellow band near the tail. Native hornets look like very large wasps, with brown legs and bright yellow and black/brown markings. Native hornets fly both night and day, while Asian hornets fly only during the day.
