Brian Wilkinson Tree Warden LGPC

My duties as local tree warden is to liaise with the public, WDBC tree officers and tree surgeons, regarding the condition of trees within the following parishes: Lewtrenchard, Marystow, Coryton, Thruselton and Stowford, keeping a watchfull eye for fallen trees, dangerous trees/limbs, diseased trees etc., especially where they impinge on public safety i.e. roads & dwellings, danger to livestock, trees close to or touching electrical/telephone cables etc.

Tree Preservation Orders (TPO's) these give legal protection to specified trees, normally trees of special interest e.g. ascetic beauty, rarity or general conservation. The landowner is responsible for TPO trees on their land, and the council for trees on council land, TPO's are served and enforced by the local council. No felling or lopping of TPO trees more than 3 inches in diameter is allowed without permission from the local council. If a TPO tree is felled it must be replaced by a tree of type specified by the local council. A large fine can be imposed if work is carried out on a TPO tree without permission.

Conservation Areas, these are areas of special historical, cultural, or environmental interest. Our nearest C.A. is Stowford also Gremansweek and the Tavistock to Bere Alston railway line. It can be assumed that all trees within the area are covered by a TPO and the same rules apply as outlined above. Much more information can be found on the WDBC web site under TPO. **Interactive Map**, on the WDBC web site there is an excellent interactive map which will show all trees with TPO's and all conservation areas. On the WDBC home page enter "Interactive Mapping" in the search box, this will bring up a map of S.W. England, zoom to desired location e.g. Lewdown, click on "Search Map" dropdown menu and select TPO, Conservation Area etc. to display required information. A good example is the Slaughter House building site which has several TPO trees marked, and C.A. for Stowford which will be marked in pink.

Tree Diseases

Ash Dieback: Now common in Devon & Cornwall, caused by an air borne fungal infection which blocks the capillaries in the wood and after several years will kill the tree.

Symptoms: In the growing season the leaves at the extremities of branches will turn brown and wither, small branches will become brittle and snap, The symptoms will slowly progress until the tree dies. Infected trees should be felled by a qualified tree surgeon.

Honey Fungus: This is a fungal infection which mainly affects the roots of trees causing them to rot and the tree to fall. The symptoms are long white strands (like fine string) around the base of the tree and underneath the lower bark, in autumn clumps of honey coloured toadstools appear at the base of the

tree.

Ganoderma Fungus: This is common in mature Beech trees, large semicircular brown fungus growing on the trunk look harmless enough, but actually doing the tree tremendous harm, destroying the cellulose of the inner wood, causing it to soften like wet cardboard, the tree will lose strength and shed limbs or eventually fall.





Minutes of ordinary meeting No 693 held on Tuesday 9th March These minutes are abbreviated, for the full minutes visit our website stowfordparishcouncil.org.uk

- Tree warden Parish role Guest speaker Mr Brian Wilkinson gave a talk on the various aspects of being a Tree Warden. Regular inspections of the trees for disease and damage. A description of the most common diseases followed, also Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) and the responsibilities to the landowners was also talked of. Mr Wilkinson kindly offered to act as the tree warden for Stowford Parish. The chair and council thanked Mr Wilkinson for the talk and his offer. The clerk to write to Mr Wilkinson and notify WDBC.
- 2. Minutes of previous meetings 693 was approved and signed by the chair as a true and accurate record of that meeting. Proposed Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Law.
- Stowford Tithe/Rental document case The case has been received, it is in storage with the clerk. Payment for the case was made possible by the support of Cllr Edmonds in obtaining a Locality Grant, Cllr Edmonds was thanked by Cllr Leroy St Louis. Protection and display of parish map. It was resolved to seek professional advice from Exeter Museum, Cllr Dunn offered to seek for info.
- 4. Finance: 8.1 Invoices due for payment DALC councillor training, Social media and essential social media £36.00,
 P van Delft Clerk salary (Jan- Feb) £176.80, HMRC Paye £44.20, P van Delft –admin expenses (Sept- March) £153.76
 Approved for payment, Proposed Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Law 8.2 R.F.O. reported that there was a credit balance of £4,878.38 after approved payments.
- 5. Planning Ref:0514/21/FUL-Change of use of garage/shed to Dogs Day Care Centre, at Broadmoorhead Farm, Lewdown. Council decision – 2 Cllrs objected, I Cllr abstained, 2 Cllrs supported, it was resolved that since there was a split decision the chair having the casting vote the application was supported. The council's comments can be viewed on the WDBC website.
- 6. Councillor reports Cllr Leroy St Louis reported that Teresa Bowers had resigned her position in the council, he thanked her for all the work and

support she gave to the council, clerk to inform WDBC. Cllr Lorna St Louis reported that highways repair work is due to commence shortly on the Sprytown Cross to the A30 section of road. Cllr Dunn reported that broadband provider Airband was seeking suitable sites and new customers in the area.

- 7. WDBC Cllr Edmonds reported that the council had agreed a balanced budget. DCC Cllr and PCC Elections were going ahead on 6th May. Broadband voucher scheme via WDBC was available, £1500 per household and £3000 per business. Community participation required for successful applications, Contact WDBC for more details.
- 8. Cllr Law Reported that at a virtual Police & Crime Commission meeting that a community speed Watch training program had started. The impending G7 meeting to be held in Cornwall will have significant security measures in place, these arrangements can be viewed on 'You Tube'. 'Cyber Crime Awareness' is a significant problem, report scam's and phishing to the police.
- 9. Remembrance Day 75 years tree consideration + location and type of tree + plaque. Cllr Lorna St Louis proposed planting a small tree plus associated planting with-in the grounds of the Parish Hall. Clerk reminded the council that permission would need to be sought from the S.P.H.C. Clerk to ask SPHC.
- 10. Facebook Council presence on the media platform details will follow at the next meeting.
- 11. Annual Parish meeting Planning the format of the meeting Chair to propose a draft agenda.
- 12. Proposal to form a sub-committee for planning applications Cllrs to look at planning applications prior to meetings and consider 'Material' & 'Non material' issues. If more information is required contact the planning officer for that specific application at the WDBC planning dept Cllr Edmonds offered to provide a useful guide to planning.



Reported a combined credit of £18,132.83. The report was approved, Proposed Cllr Southcott, seconded Cllr Andrews.

- 6. BT Telephone Kiosk Unfortunately BT will not sell the Kiosk because it sits on BT land and is not the type of kiosk it allows to be sold.
- 7. Councillor vacancy for Marystow Parish a vacancy still stands.
- 8. Cllr Mott (WDBC) provided the monthly report, this was circulated.
- 9. Councillor reports: Cllr Yeo asked if the black bin waste trials were continuing, Cllr Southcott to enquire. Cllr Yeo also reported an accident near the Wye junction, with damage caused to the hedgerow. Cllr Wilkinson reported that he had undertaken a survey of the pavement from the sports ground to the school, the recommended width should be 2 mtrs however in some places it only measured 1 mtr, unfortunately at the narrowest point it will be difficult to widen the pavement. Cllr Vanstone reported potholes and poor metal on the Whiteborough Farm – Thrushelford Farm highway, Cllr Southgate to provide photos to D.H. Bridge stonework dislodging's on the bridge at Thrushelford, registered with DH ref 211409397, and at the bridge at Foxcombe registered with D.H. ref 211409398. Cllr Perkins reported that there were now many more pot-holes in Marystow lane, Cllr Harrop to register again. Cllr Andrews reported that drainage water from the Crossroads development is causing significant issues in the parish, Cllr Southcott is working with WDBC on the problem. - 13. Future Parish Council meetings A resumption of public meetings is scheduled to start on 24th May (subject to jurisdiction), Cllr Harrop provided a draft risk assessment and council meeting procedure to provide public and councillor safety against Covid 19 at the meetings.
- 14. Correspondence Lewdown W.I. request, HMRC Paye credit balance.
- Items for inclusion at a future meeting to include, Commemorative VE Day plaque cost and inscription.
