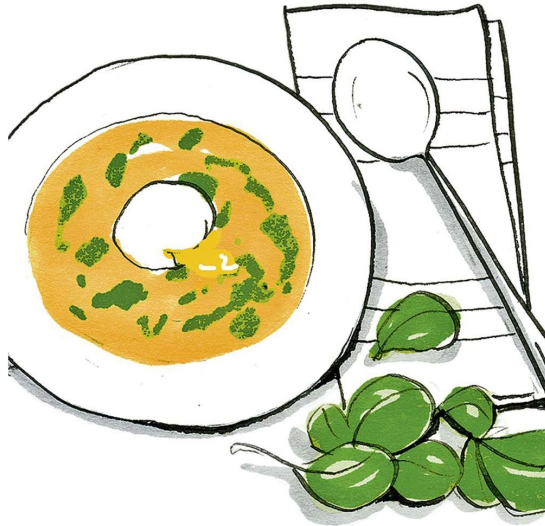

Voter Identification

From May 2023 people will need to produce an accepted form of photographic ID to prove their identity before they will be issued with a ballot paper. This includes people acting as a proxy for other individuals.

This is a national change implemented as part of the Elections Act 2022.

This will apply for the local elections taking place in the South Hams and West Devon on 4 May 2023.

To vote in person voters must be on the electoral register **and** bring a suitable form of photographic ID to their polling station. The most commonly used IDs include:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Photographic driving licence issued by the UK, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (including provisional)
- European Economic Area (EEA) photographic ID Card
- UK Biometric Residence Permit
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (PASS card)
- A Blue Badge
- A concessionary travel pass funded by HM Government or local authority

A full list of the photo ID that will be accepted is available on the Gov.UK site.

No suitable photo ID?

Where an individual does not have one of these accepted forms of photo ID, they can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. This can be obtained, for free, from their local Electoral Registration Officer. The document contains an elector's name and photograph.

You must be on the electoral register to apply.

Apply for a Voter Authority Certificate on the Gov.UK website .

The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate for the local elections in England on 4 May 2023 is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April 2023.

Voters who do not produce a Voter Authority Certificate, or valid photo identification, will not be allowed to vote on the day.

Postal voting

Postal voters will not be affected and will be issued with their postal ballot papers as usual.

Meeting No 715 Minutes of ordinary meeting held on 14th March 2023

These abbreviated minutes are provisional until they are signed by the chair at the next meeting of the parish council. For the full minutes see our website.

1. Broadband – Fibre update and presentation from Airband. Faye Cross explained the process how the Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) would work. Questions were asked regarding options and promotions that are available to interested households and businesses, also how to upgrade the services and what support there was for customers. Councillors also asked when the service would come 'live' in the village and its neighbouring hamlets with-in the parish, more detail was requested with a preferred timescale being provided by Airband.
2. Minutes of previous meeting 714 were signed by the chair as a true and accurate record of that meeting. Proposed by Cllr Lorna St Louis, seconded Cllr Govett, all in favour
3. Finance – 3.1 Payments were authorised for the following invoices – Clerk salary P van Delft (Feb- March) £224.80, HMRC – PAYE £20.80, P. van Delft (Clerk administration expenses) £136.02, Proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour.
3.2 R.F.O. Reported a credit balance after payments of £4,741.27
3.3 Kings Coronation Grant application – Cllr supported the motion to apply for the grant to help with the celebrations, if successful the council will be notified on 23rd March. Motion proposed by Cllr Govett, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour
3.4 Renewal of Caroline Harris Bookkeeping services annual contract (Payroll provider), it was resolved to accept the contract for the year 2023-24 at £165pa, proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded by Cllr Lorna St Louis, all in favour.
3.5 Asset register – After consultation with Dalc, a review was required because the R.F.O. included all the repairs to the hall of which some should not have been included on the current register. The revised register was approved proposed by Cllr Leroy St Louis, seconded Cllr Lorna St Louis all in favour.
4. Local elections – Parish councillor candidates – Cllrs Leroy St Louis, Lorna St Louis, and Govett wished to stand as parish councillors for the elections. Cllrs Kenyon and Hennessey are standing down.
5. Cllr Edmonds reported that WDBC in partnership with D.C.C. had the bid of £13.4 million from the 'Levelling Up' fund accepted. Money will go towards a new transport hub in Okehampton for a new railway station, bus route and car parking.
6. Cllr Reports. Cllr Govett wished the council to follow up on the questions raised with Airband at the earlier presentation.
7. Safeguarding of the 1839 Parish Map – update. The clerk reported that the map was at the printers and it was hoped that the work would soon be carried out
8. Defibrillator training – The chair reported that the training was being organised by the Parish Hall committee, the chair to enquire what date has been set.
9. Coronation of King Charles III – 6th May 2023, parish celebration arrangements. Cllr Govett requested that an advert and promotion of the council activities should take place a.s.a.p to ensure as many residents are aware of the festivities.
10. Mailchimp – Promotion and circulation. Cllr Govett reported that only two people had

signed up to the service, Cllr Govett suggested that the various associations, clubs and groups may wish to sign up.

11. Items for inclusion at the next meeting – Invite Cllr Samuel to the Annual Parish Meeting.

We met on April 3 at Lewdown Victory Hall. Margaret welcomed 16 members to our April meeting plus our speaker Anita Townsend. Business was short this time; we had a lovely thank you card from Roy Stacey & family and 4 birthdays to celebrate.



Time to hand over to our speaker: Anita Townsend for some inspired drawing. Anita is a local lady living in Chillaton. She started by showing us how to draw a straight line & a circle free hand, but quite accurately. We then had to draw a rectangle on our A4 paper and fill it in with charcoal, smudge it about a bit thus creating a negative space. Anita then drew the outline of a rabbit and some flowers with charcoal, rubbing away the inside of the line created a much lighter colour for the body of the rabbit. Not everyone drew a rabbit, some drew the beautiful fresh flowers that Anita had brought along, some were inspired by the way the charcoal was smudged on the paper, some draw caricatures. The results were some very good art works. Anita handed out some sheets with tips about shape & proportion and recommended reading material. Anita's final advice: Try to keep a sketchbook to practice & make memories, doodle, enjoy drawing, it helps one to notice & pay attention to the world. It was such a nice evening; Anita is very gentle and encouraging, clearly an excellent artist, the hall went quiet for quite some time as we all worked away, a wonderful atmosphere.

The Lewdown and area local history group

Visit to
St Clether Chapel and Holy Well
Tuesday 16th May
Meet 6.30 pm at Lewdown Post Office
for 7.00 at St Clether church (SX 206844)

Our visit is to this medieval chapel and holy well, nestled in the beautiful Inney valley on the edge of Bodmin Moor. The well chapel actually has quite a connection with our area, as the second of three restorations was arranged by the Rev. Sabine-Baring Gould of Lewtrenchard in the 1890s. The well house has a deep, clear spring of water which, unusually, then flows into the chapel and behind the altar to a stone basin on the exterior. Following the death of the chapel's founder, St Clederus, in the 6th century the waters became renowned for their healing powers. The well chapel is the largest in Cornwall and beautifully preserved.

It is about an 20-mile drive from Lewdown, via the A30 and A395 and lifts should be available. We can park at the present church, and then walk about a third of a mile (half a km) across fields to the chapel and well. The path is uneven, and may be muddy, with short ups and downs, so stout footwear should be worn. Obviously dress for the forecast weather!

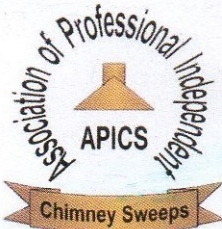

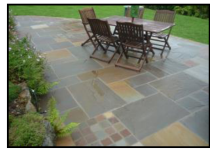

Minute No 759 of Monday 27th March 2023 held at Lewdown Victory Hall

These abbreviated minutes are provisional until they have been agreed and signed by the chairman of the next meeting.

Council decision – Support – proposed by Cllr Southcott seconded Cllr Wilkinson, Cllrs Metherell and Vanstone abstained, motion carried. For details of the councils comments visit the WDBC website for planning.
5. WDBC Cllr Mott reported that not much new business is taking place at the moment because of the restrictions on it due to the council elections in May.
6. Reports from councillors – Cllr Wilkinson reported on the D.H. website a pot-hole at Lewtrenchard Church. Cllrs Perkins and Yeo reported the missing sign at Lowertown, Coryton. Cllr Wilkinson had been asked to repair the bench at Lewtrenchard Church.
7. Vehicle activated signs update – Cllr Southcott reported that the VAS has been delivered, outstanding and waiting is for highways to do the installation of the poles for which it will be positioned on. 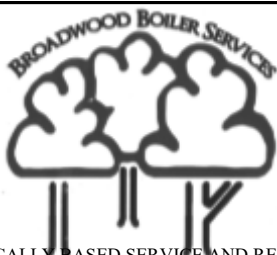
